our hospitals in good hands

Change is all around us. The weather, seasons and each of us are in constant flux. So, too, are the organizations that provide critical services to our communities.

Soon Howard Young Medical Center, located in Minocqua, Wisconsin, and Eagle River Hospital, in Eagle River, Wisconsin, will be under new ownership as Aspirus steps up its role in northern Wisconsin.

The Howard Young Medical Center and Eagle River Hospital, along with five other Ascension hospitals, 21 physician clinics, and air and ground medical transport services, are also part of the transition, moving from one set of good hands to another.

“Aspirus is a first-rate medical organization, and I can’t help but feel this is a very positive move for the patients in our area,” said Dr. Barry Seidel, a surgeon at Howard Young Medical Center for 40 years and a current member of the Howard Young Foundation Board of Directors. “I hope, under the control of Aspirus, Howard Young Medical Center will focus on providing high-quality medical and surgical care locally to the people of our community.”

Aspirus, providing nationally recognized excellence in healthcare, is a non-profit, community-directed healthcare system based in Wausau, Wisconsin. Its 8,700 employees focus on improving the health and

well-being of individuals in their service areas through compassion, collaboration, accountability and foresight.

Once the transition is complete, Howard Young Medical Center and Eagle River Hospital will join the Aspirus family bringing their total coverage to 13 hospitals in Wisconsin, four hospitals in Upper Michigan, more than 70 clinics, home health and hospice care, pharmacies, critical care and air-medical transport, medical goods, nursing homes and a broad network of physicians. In April, the Aspirus MedEvac helicopter relocated from Wausau to Howard Young Medical Center in Woodruff, allowing Aspirus to rapidly transport patients in rural areas and improve the quality of care provided to patients in our Northwoods communities.

The dedication to bringing top quality care to patients and communities is already an indelible part of Howard Young Medical Center and Eagle River Hospital, and the Aspirus healthcare network. Aspirus has been recognized by IBM Watson Health as a Top 15 Health System for three consecutive years in its annual studies identifying the top-performing health systems in the country.

“With the help of Aspirus, I’m looking forward to the prospect of Howard Young Medical Center as a full service community hospital which has a good working relationship with all the medical providers of the community, and with the Foundation,” Dr. Seidel remarked. “And of course I feel the Foundation will continue to support these efforts.”

Our Northwoods hospitals, working within the Aspirus system, will continue to provide exceptional care to our residents and visitors. We’re all in good hands.

SUPPORTING EMERGENCY HEALTHCARE

Generosity has deep roots in the Northwoods and each Howard Young Foundation donor has a story about why they support state-of-the-art healthcare, including Nancy and Joe Masterson.

The Mastersons have spent the past fifty summers on Trout Lake, nestled between Minocqua and Boulder Junction, Wisconsin. They consider the lake, and the community, a Northwoods paradise.

“My husband used to go fishing near Three Lakes when he was a little boy, and said he’d like to go camping up there,” Nancy recalled. “So, we packed up our three children, all under the age of four, and traveled to northern Wisconsin from Illinois where we lived at the time. Unfortunately, it rained nonstop, and the temperatures were cold. It did not take long for Nancy to decide that this was not for her. Joe suggested they go to Coon’s Franklin Lodge on Trout Lake, a place recommended by a friend.

While there was nothing open for the full week, a guest had just canceled for the first day of their booking, so the Mastersons were able to stay the night.

“We loved it so much we made reservations there for the next six years,” related Nancy. “Then we bought our own cottage on Trout Lake near Coons. We still go there to eat, and two of our grandchildren have had jobs there as well.”

Nancy and Joe encouraged their grandchildren to seek the jobs because, as proprietors of family-owned businesses themselves, they know the importance of work and responsibility. As business owners, they also understand the importance of good medical care for their employees and family. That is why they supported the Howard Young Foundation's efforts to fund new patient monitors for Howard Young Medical Center's emergency department (ED).

"We read an article where Trig Solberg, Board Chairman of the Howard Young Foundation, described the need for the new 17-unit patient monitor system for Howard Young Medical Center, an acute care hospital with 24/7 emergency services," Nancy recalled. "We felt it was something that was very important for the community to have, and we wanted to help."

"A well-equipped emergency department is clearly a high priority for the hospital," Joe added. "Hopefully, we won't ever have to use it, but we think it needs to be available to everyone and be as up-to-date as possible."

Nancy and Joe now live in Naples, Florida, but they still look forward to summers at their Trout Lake home with their children and grandchildren. The family enjoys fishing, swimming, hiking, water skiing and boating, but most of all, they love spending their time together in Wisconsin's beautiful Northwoods.

Thanks to the generosity of the Mastersons and 147 other community donors, our 2020 Year End Appeal was a success. The new monitors have been purchased and are used to help the ED function at optimum capacity and performance. They make it possible to monitor patients' vitals from a central location and minimize the number of times staff members need to enter and leave a patient room, reducing the risk of spreading infection. The level of cardiac monitoring made possible in the ED now is unmatched in our rural community.

COVID-19 VACCINE CLINICS



Because of COVID-19, “normal” life in our community and worldwide has been on hold since March of 2020. But our chances of returning to normal are increasing with COVID-19 vaccinations.

Amy Koepke, APNP, Certified Family Health Nurse Practitioner, has worked in COVID-19 vaccine clinics at Howard Young Medical Center.

“We have vaccine clinics at Howard Young Medical Center two days a week,” Amy said. “People are excited to get their vaccine and will wait in line to get on the schedule. We’re vaccinating up to 110 a day. It’s going very well, and we will be able to do more when the vaccine supply increases.”

Howard Young Medical Center has been administering the Moderna vaccine. About two weeks after the second dose, the patient’s immunity is generally at about 95 percent. That makes them much less likely to contract COVID. And since there is no live COVID virus in the vaccine, patients can’t get the illness from the vaccine.

“Receiving the vaccine also relieves stress for patients and gives them some peace of mind, especially if they’re around other people in their age group who have been vaccinated. Not only is it protective for the individual receiving it, but for those around them as well because it

reduces the spread,” Amy stated. “All of this is beneficial for overall physical health as well as mental and emotional health and well-being. You can find the latest recommendations about masking, social distancing and more on the Centers for Disease Control website.”

Amy strongly encourages anyone who is eligible for a vaccine to get one. The more people vaccinated, the fewer opportunities for the illness to spread, and that’s good for the whole community.

“What is exciting about our school is that we are able to tap into our students' unique potential and really maximize their capabilities with a transition focus,” said Eric Mikoleit, Lakeland STAR School and Academy's director and lead teacher. “We create an atmosphere and environment that embraces and fosters their individual strengths so they are better prepared to go off to college or into the workforce.”

One way the school helps bolster independence is by offering driver education. The course is taught by Eric, a teacher the students already know, which helps put them at ease.

“We've had five students successfully complete driver's education and get their license,” Eric commented. “Four of those students drive to school every day. One of them, John Steffen, drives down from Boulder Junction, nearly an hour drive on a good day.”

John, a person with autism, has been a student at Lakeland STAR for two years and, like most 16-year-olds, likes driving.

“I like driving because I can go anywhere I want,” said John. “I wanted to get my driver's license so I could go to work. I wanted to work so I could earn money and gain experience.”

Identifying interests and aptitudes is part of a student's Independent Education Plan, and John showed an interest in diesel mechanics and working with his hands. Eric began contacting Minocqua businesses to see if they could set up a work experience which is often a short-term job shadow type of situation.

"Truck Country was one that responded with open arms," Eric shared. "We sat down with Doug McCoy, one of the owners, and he moved absolute mountains for us. We discussed opportunities with the two managers in the Minocqua store and got the ball rolling."

Doug then invited Eric, John, occupational therapist Dawn Pieper and speech therapist Kris Webster to do a presentation for Truck Country staff about autism. Dawn and Kris both work with Lakeland STAR students throughout the curriculum.

"We gave the Truck Country staff updated information about the prevalence of autism and some of the communication issues that can occur," Kris said. "Dawn went into some of the sensory and motor considerations. Eric talked about academics and job skill training. Then John gave his part of the presentation and answered questions."

The training gave Truck Country employees an insight into John and what it would be like to work with him and helped John see what it would be like to work with them. Both parties agreed it seemed like a good fit, so John went through the real-world job application process, including an interview after practicing and 'pre-talking' with Kris. He is now a paid employee of Truck Country.

"I work on semi-trucks and other large equipment like that," John shared. "The money is good, and it is fun for me. This job is a good match for me."

John drives himself from school to work and back. Though the original plan was for him to work three days a week, he wants to work five days a week because he loves his job.

"Within the first week of John working there, he came back just so excited because he got to watch them and got to actually have his hands inside the truck," said Dawn. "He was like, 'This is what I want to do.' It was a sealed deal at that point."

It's important to the Lakeland STAR team that work experiences are positive for their students – and employers. They are more than willing to provide an orientation for employers and students and are committed to helping students acclimate to their work environment and the people around. This helps ensure success on the job.

The school's success is certainly due to the dedication of the staff and support of the community, but it is also thanks to the commitment of those who donate to autism services through the Howard Young Foundation.

"I really appreciate how community-oriented the Foundation is and that they are looking at the big picture of health," Dawn said. "Their generosity is huge in funding things that make such an impact on the health and wellness of our students."

"We're now in our third year, and the generosity in our community and the Foundation continues to support our school at levels that are unprecedented," commented Eric. "It's mind-blowing."



Helping those in need

Even a pandemic can't stop Lakeland Pantry from helping those in need. If anything, this important local asset has proven just how resourceful it is.

"We never closed our doors," said Lorna Springate, director of Lakeland Pantry. "We switched to curbside pick-up for clients and kept working. And now, thanks to Tracy Hand and the Howard Young Medical Center, most of our volunteers are fully vaccinated. We wouldn't be able to function without our volunteers, and I'm so happy they now have this extra level of protection."

The Pantry leveraged COVID-19 recovery grant opportunities to provide special food packages for infants, toddlers, school-age children and senior citizens in addition to purchasing food for their regular clientele. They also received grants to help with the purchase of other goods and equipment.

"During this extremely trying year, we were so fortunate that agencies stepped up to approve our grant requests," Lorna said. "This allowed the Pantry to continue its community support."

One of these grants was used to purchase and install a Flex Farm. This self-contained, indoor garden is situated inside the Pantry and allows them to grow their own lettuce throughout the year, increasing the amount of fresh produce they can provide to clients.

Something Lakeland Pantry did have to put on hold because of COVID-19 was a much-needed addition to their building, but the plans are back in action with a ground breaking scheduled for late this summer.

"We're very excited for this project to be underway," Lorna remarked. "It will provide us with more space, an inside area to unload trucks which increases safety for volunteers, a new walk-in freezer and more cooler space for things like Farmers to Families boxes that contain dairy, meat and fresh produce."

In addition to the number of grants the Pantry has received, they've also benefited from community member's generosity. According to Lorna, no one should go hungry, and people in our area want to help those in need. It's a good thing too because the Pantry is seeing an increase of 10 to 15 new households seeking help each month.

CENTER OF EXCELLENCE**

STAY SAFE during TICK SEASON

Warm weather is here in Wisconsin's beautiful Northwoods. That means camping, hiking, biking and many other outdoor activities. It also means tick season. Fortunately, world-renowned medical expertise is ready to help at the Tick-Borne Illness Center of Excellence located in Howard Young Medical Center.

"Northern Wisconsin is one of the most beautiful places in the Midwest. However, it also has a high prevalence of tick-borne diseases," said Ashley Johnson, Nurse Practitioner at the Center. "We always encourage people to enjoy nature to the fullest and not fear tick-borne diseases; however, preventing tick bites plays an important role in staying safe while outdoors."

During the 2020 tick season staff at the Center saw patients for 137 chronic tick-borne illnesses. They also saw 229 acute tick bite patients and processed 59 ticks for testing.

TICKS ARE TYPICALLY MOST ACTIVE IN WISCONSIN FROM SPRING THROUGH SUMMER. HERE ARE A FEW WAYS TO HELP YOU STAY SAFE DURING TICK SEASON.

- 1 Wear permethrin-treated clothing. Wear insect repellent spray with 20-30 % DEET on clothes and skin.
- 2 Wear high socks over your pant legs and light-colored clothing to cover your arms and legs when outside in areas where tick activity is likely.
- 3 Check for ticks after being outside, especially along hairlines, armpits, ears, belly button and groin. The longer a tick is attached, the higher the risk of contracting a tick-borne illness.
- 4 Put the clothes you wore outside in the dryer for fifteen minutes on high heat to kill any ticks that may be attached to your clothing.
- 5 Use tick protection for your pets, like chewable tablets, topical applications and tick collars and be sure to check them thoroughly for ticks after they've been outside

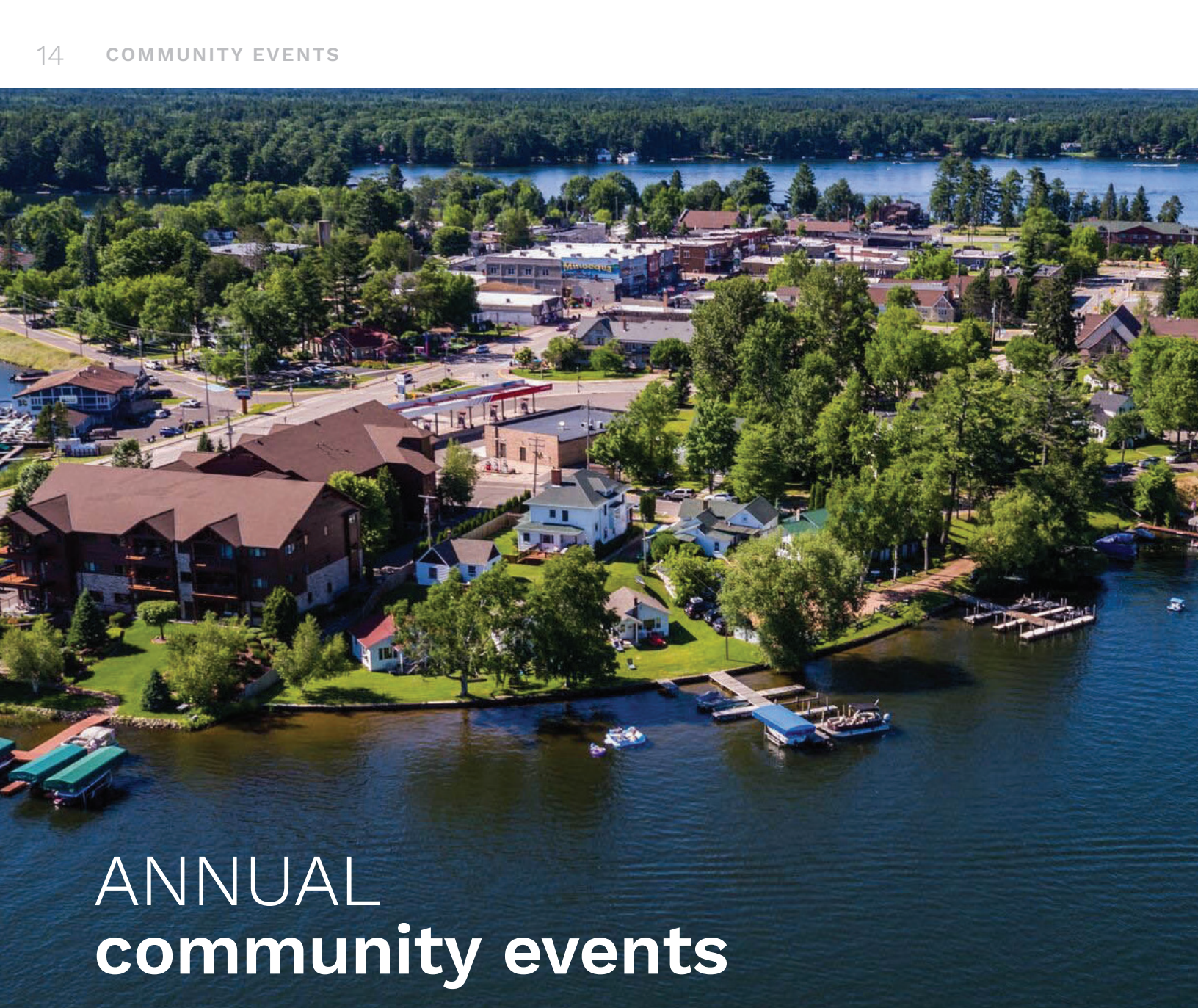
If you find a tick embedded in your skin, seek medical attention to obtain preventive treatment. You can also have the tick type-categorized at the Center. For more information about these services, call the Center at 715.203.1616.

If you've been bitten by a diseased tick, symptoms typically show up within three to 30 days.

"Lyme disease symptoms may resemble a viral-like illness or 'summer flu' including a low-grade fever, sore throat, lymph node swelling and fatigue," said Dr. Samuel Shor, MD, FACP, Tick-Borne Illness Center Clinician and Past President of The International Lyme and Associated Diseases Society (ILADS). "The symptoms may go away on their own, but if they're not treated appropriately with antibiotics, the illness could create long-term issues such as arthritis or chronic fatigue."

Dr. Shor also stated that not everyone with Lyme disease develops the classic bulls-eye rash and most of us don't remember a tick bite, so we need to remain vigilant to other symptoms and seek medical attention as soon as possible. The Center is a valuable resource to patients and clinicians in our community and throughout the Midwest.

Turn appreciated stocks into charitable gifts

Most of us have made donations by cash or check, but did you know there are additional ways to give that offer the added benefit of tax savings? You can use appreciated stocks as gifts to support your favorite charitable organization, including the Howard Young Foundation.

They put together the following tips to help you better understand the 'whys' and 'hows' of gifting appreciated stocks.

THE POTENTIAL BENEFITS OF GIFTING APPRECIATED STOCK THAT YOU'VE HELD FOR AT LEAST ONE YEAR INCLUDE:

1. Satisfaction of knowing your money is invested in a cause important to you.
2. Reduction or elimination of capital gains taxes.
3. Eligibility to receive an income tax charitable deduction for the full fair-market-value of the stock at the time of the gift.

Check with your tax advisor for more specifics about deductions.

HOW TO GIFT YOUR APPRECIATED STOCK.

After you've discussed the tax or legal implications of your investments with your independent tax or legal advisor, call the Howard Young Foundation at 715.439.4005 to inform them of the gift you are planning to make and request Depository Trust Company (DTC) transfer instructions from the Foundation. With the DTC instructions in hand, contact your broker or financial advisor to request the shares of stock you'd like to transfer to the Foundation brokerage account. It usually takes just a few days for the transfer to occur.

Gifts of appreciated assets aren't limited to just stocks. Appreciated shares of mutual funds and Exchange-Traded Funds that are up in value and have been held for longer than one year can be transferred to the Howard Young Foundation using the same DTC instructions noted above.

The Howard Young Foundation does not provide financial or tax advice and encourages donors interested in advanced planning to speak with their CPA and/or tax advisor.
